

## On-Site Motorized Vehicle Safety Course Description

### Terminal Learning Objective (TLO):

Upon completion of this training course, participants will have a greater awareness of: their rights and their employer’s responsibilities under OSHA; the working conditions that result in “struck-by” and “caught-between” hazards involving on-site motorized vehicles; and, the best work practices that help protect workers from those hazards.

### Enabling Learning Objectives (ELOs):

The participants will be able to:

- Describe their rights under the Occupational Safety & Health Act,
- Describe their employer’s responsibilities under the Occupational Safety & Health Act,
- Recognize a variety of “struck-by” and “caught-between” hazards in the workplace that involve motorized vehicles on their work sites,
- Discuss the best work practices in the prevention of incidents related to on-site motorized vehicle movement, and
- List at least four actions an employee can personally take to prevent these incidents.
