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Farmworker Justice proposes to provide 0.5 hours of extreme temperature training to 1,350 workers and employers in the agricultural industry. The targeted audience includes limited-English speaking, temporary, minority, and at-risk workers. Training will include heat-related illness prevention and response. The organization plans to use/revise training materials from previous Harwood grants. Trainings will be in Spanish and Haitian Creole.

**Training Topic: Chemical Hazards/Hazard Communication**

<b>Alliance of Hazardous Materials Professionals, Inc.</b>	<b>Saint Paul</b>	<b>MN</b>	<b>\$160,000</b>
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Alliance of Hazardous Materials Professionals, Inc. proposes to provide 4 hours of hazard communication training to 420 employers and workers in the nail salon industry. Training will include chemical hazards, labeling, safety data sheets, and personal protective measures. The organization plans to use/revise training materials they previously developed.
