BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, Missouri workers provide services that improve our families, communities, our great state, and the world; and

WHEREAS, all citizens have the right to come home safely and health at the end of their workday; and

WHEREAS, Missourians tragically lose their lives each year on the job while others suffer injuries and illnesses; and

WHEREAS, the Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA) and Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations' Division of Labor Standards shall continue their commitment to workplace safety to reduce the number of workplace fatalities, accidents, and illnesses; and

WHEREAS, we honor the memory of Missouri's fallen workforce and rededicate our efforts to improve safety and health in every workplace in the state; and

WHEREAS, we ask all Missourians to remember, thank, and honor Americans who have been injured or lost their lives while on the job.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MIKE KEHOE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, do hereby proclaim April 28, 2026, to be

WORKERS' MEMORIAL DAY

in Missouri.
