## **Take the Challenge**



Workplace inspections are an important tool for identifying hazards and resolving them. Whether you inspect your workplace on a regular basis or are just getting your workplace safety and health program started, conduct a safety walkaround to show how you have **Eyes on Safety**.

- You'll need to familiarize yourself with the workplace, its operations, and the most hazardous work areas, tasks, or activities.
- Make an inspection checklist using examples from the OSHA small business handbook or other published sources.
- Determine what Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) you'll need.
- Conduct your Safety Walkaround. Inspect each work area starting with easily identifiable hazards, talk to workers, including new hires, and note hazards that need to be evaluated further.
- Follow up on what you found. Prioritize the hazards you found based on how severe an injury could be and how likely an injury is to happen. Share this information with management and ask for their commitment to fix hazards.
