



FIND & FIX HAZARDS: USING RESPIRATORY PROTECTION

The Safe + Sound Campaign encourages every workplace in the U.S. to have a safety and health program, a proactive approach to identifying and managing workplace hazards before they cause injury or illness.

In 2016, there were **4,500 estimated nonfatal injuries** from acute inhalation of harmful substances (U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics). Chronic exposures to harmful substances remains an even bigger hazard. Finding and fixing hazards ensures workers go home safe and sound every day. Respirators protect workers against insufficient oxygen environments, harmful dusts, fogs, smokes, mists, gases, vapors, and sprays. These hazards may cause cancer, lung impairment, diseases, or death. Use the information below to make sure that your respiratory protection program is protecting your workers.
