- Observing Workers' Memorial Day on April 28, 2025, as a day to remember people who passed away on the job or were injured while working;
- Committing to building a better understanding and training to create a safer workplace; and
- Dedicating ourselves to helping American workplaces maintain a safe environment for their teammates.
