

EMERGENCY EVACUATION SCAVENGER HUNT

Welcome to the Find 4 Emergency Evacuation Scavenger Hunt! Use this activity to reinforce critical emergency evacuation procedures in a fun and interactive way with your staff.

- Get moving! Have everyone walk their evacuation route using the **Find 4 Checklist** (see next page) to prompt them to find:
 - exit routes
- helpful resources
- evacuation obstacles
- their assembly point
- 2 Before starting:
 - Emphasize that this is an activity—not a real emergency.
 - Consider setting up staged obstacles or post signs along the evacuation route to make workers think about what they might see or encounter in a real emergency. (Refer to "**Prep Tips**" for ideas.)
- ³ Hold a group discussion at the end of the activity to ask workers what they learned and what they would improve.
- Update your evacuation procedures based on lessons learned.

PREP TIPS

- Station someone along the evacuation route dressed as flames (or holding a sign with flames) to simulate a blocked route.
- Use bright-colored tape on the floor labeled "electrical cord" or "hose" to simulate a trip hazard.
- Place a large picture or sign of a forklift in an aisle to simulate a blocked route.
- Hang posters in strategic locations:

Location	Message
Evacuation route	If this route is blocked, which way would you go?
Near an emergency resource	Help is always nearby! Find a helpful tool to use during an emergency.
Assembly point	You are safe, but is everyone else? What can you do to help account for your co-workers?

Safety Reminder

Always follow proper safety protocols during activities. Do not introduce any real hazards (e.g., blocked egress) when preparing for the activity.
