On November 18, 2016, OSHA issued a final rule updating its general industry Walking-Working Surfaces standards. In the preamble, the final rule explicitly rescinds STD 01-01-010 and all subsequent letters of interpretation allowing guardrails to have a minimum height of 36 inches.
